Cerebral Palsy help

Members soon realized that not enough trained therapists were available to help children afflicted with cerebral palsy. To help fill this critical need, they developed a national cerebral palsy scholarship program to assist in 1955.

By 1959, the association had granted 234 scholarships accounting for \$84,728 in contributions. The association's visionary leaders had a plan in 1955 which became the Scholarships for Therapists program!
