Today's program was Sharon McMahon and Dave Schroeder and the Lincoln Park Theatre Company's Production of CATS.

The production will be held in Lincoln Park July 14th and 15th at 8pm, and July 16th at 6pm and is FREE to the public. The production is the result of a joint effort from the Municipal Band, Laurel School of Dance and the Lincoln Park Theatre Company, and is made possible by grants from the Danville and Illinois Arts Councils, along with support from local residents and businesses.

There will be up to 60 actors on stage during the show, and the cast ranges in age from 10 to 84 years of age. Andrew Phillips recommends researching story lines and characters by checking out T.S. Elliot's Practical Cats.

While the performances are free to the public, a great deal of cost is involved. Rights to the show alone totaled \$5000, and because an elaborate costume and set are required it is estimated that costs approach the neighborhood of \$10k!
